Becoming a National Board Certified Teacher

National Board Certification candidate subsidies of \$2000 are available for teacher candidates through the Illinois State National Board Resource Center for the 2013-2014 school year. This certification is designed to help you become an even better teacher while validating your professional strengths . It leads to being eligible to be an Illinois Master Teacher and can increase your salary.

Take One!, an introduction to National Board certification, provides a way to learn about the teaching standards for the certification, the process of analyzing your teaching and how to more deeply reflect on your practices. Take One is an introduction to the National Board Teacher Certification process through analysis of a video of your classroom learning environment. There is a subsidy for the entire cost of Take One that is available as well.
